



# Lego Therapy Group Information Session

**Come along to our Lego Group information session and learn more about what is Lego Therapy!**

Lego therapy has been designed for children with autism spectrum disorders to support social skill development with peers using the much loved medium of Lego. Groups of four children each take on a specific role (Builder, Supplier, Engineer and Foreman) to work collaboratively together to build a Lego model.

Children will then have the opportunity to work together on a free-play construction.



Skills to be developed within Lego Builders include:

- ◆ Turn-taking, sharing
- ◆ Collaborative working and problem solving
- ◆ Giving and following instructions
- ◆ Communicating ideas and negotiation

To participate, children need to:

- ◆ Aged 5-7 years
- ◆ Use sentences to communicate
- ◆ Have an interest in Lego
- ◆ Be able to sit to make a small Lego model
